Community Relations Councils Keeps YOU Informed!

While the world has been focused on COVID-19 numbers of infected persons, deaths, etc., close to home our neighbors in Aiken, Barnwell, Berkeley, Colleton, Hampton, Marlboro, Oconee, Orangeburg, and Pickens counties have another added burden after a deadly storm hit South Carolina in April. Experts report that this was one of our State's deadliest tornado outbreaks in over 30 years and includes the strongest tornado to hit the state since 1995. The Hampton County storm was only the 11th EF-4 tornado in the state since 1950 (<https://www.usnews.com/news/best-states/south-carolina/articles/2020-04-24/deadly-april-sc-storm-had-strongest-tornado-since-1995>).

We appreciate Community Relations Councils (CRCs) in Allendale and the newly formed Orangeburg Human Relations Council for keeping the SCHAC informed of the storm damage in their respective counties. Let us know if you need assistance because our Community Relations staff will work to make sure you are aware of the resources available during this time of crisis. Below is information that SCHAC is sharing with our CRC members across the state.

The role of the South Carolina Recovery Program is to serve as a direct liaison between the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and all applicants requesting federal disaster assistance. Our trained recovery staff will make every effort to effectively communicate, coordinate, collaborate, and cooperate with applicants through the grant process.

The mission of FEMA's Public Assistance Grant Program is to provide assistance to state, tribal and local governments, and certain types of private nonprofit organizations so that communities can quickly respond to and recover from major disasters or emergencies declared by the President.
